

**Aski, Janice M. 1995.** Verbal suppletion: an analysis of Italian, French and Spanish to go. *Linguistics* 33. 403-432.

The article presents the morphological patterns for the replacement of etymological verb stems with etymologically unrelated (suppletive) stems. It is claimed that such patterns are language-specific. Historic processes motivating the rise of the patterns are described. Case study – the replacement of the Latin verb *ire* by forms of *vadere* in Romance languages. For morphological patterns in view, the term “template” is introduced: "Templates are language-specific conjugational frameworks that are pre-existing in the synchronic view but have evolved over time as a result of diverse developments from Latin. Once established in the system, templates serve as guides to morphological restructuring of verbal paradigms". Templates are language and dialect specific which predicts that places for suppletive forms in paradigms will vary cross-linguistically.
