









What is Surrey Scholars?

Surrey Scholars is the award winning sustained programme of extra curricular outreach from the University of Surrey for learners in Years 9 to 13.

It is a progressive series of hybrid activity designed to prepare for GCSEs, Further and Higher Education. Our flexible model enables learners to access as much content and opportunity as they feel is beneficial in support of their current studies and future pathways.

Our aim is to widen access into Higher Education amongst demographics which are underrepresented within university or alternative study pathways. As of 2020, 74% of our Higher Education ready Surrey Scholars entered university. Furthermore, 42% of our Free School Meal eligible Surrey Scholars entered university compared to 28% nationally and 18% across Surrey. Our work has been recognised within the higher education sector and by the UK Social Mobility Awards as an example of best practice.

We currently have over 1000* active Scholars and we look forward to welcoming you onto the programme.

What is included?

Surrey Scholars is fully funded and **FREE** for eligible learners only. Participants apply directly to take part and can receive the following:



Surrey Scholars receive a welcome pack and access to our online portal prior to commencing any activity. Notebooks and stationary are provided at all in person events.



In person Surrey Scholars events take place at the University of Surrey on advertised dates. Transport support is available, either as pre-booked or reimbursement of travel expenses.

IT

Live online Surrey Scholars activity is hosted on Microsoft Teams and made available through web browser. Device and/or internet support/assistance is available upon request.

Certificate

Surrey Scholars must complete a minimum of 50% of live sessions within a single activity to receive a certificate of participation and to be invited onto future opportunities.









Contextual Admissions

Surrey Scholars are eligible for a contextual offer from the University of Surrey.

Eligibility

To be eligible for Surrey Scholars, you will be in Year 9, 10, 11, 12 or 13 and meet at least one of the following eligibility criteria:

- You live in an area of higher deprivation as measured by postcode (IMD Deciles 1 or 2*).
- You live in an area of low progression into higher education (POLAR4 Q1*).
- You have received Free School Meals within the last 6 years.
- · You receive a 16-19 bursary.
- You have a diagnosed disability or long term health condition.
- You are a young carer (you care for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without you support).
- You are care experienced (you have spent time in local authority care, in a residential children's home, have been looked after at home by a supervision order or have lived with relatives under kinship care).
- You are a forced migrant (a refugee or an asylum seeking young person).
- You are from a Gypsy, Roma, Traveller, Showperson or Boater community.

*Indices of Multiple Deprivation are commonly used datasets within the UK to classify the relative deprivation within smaller areas You can find an IMD look up tool on our website. To be eligible, you must live in an IMD Decile 1 or 2 postcode.

**POLAR4 classifies the progression rate of young people in higher education within local areas across the UK. You can find a POLAR4 look up tool on our website. To be eligible, you must live in a POLAR4 Quintile 1 postcode.

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How to Apply

If you meet one of our eligibility criteria, applying to become a Surrey Scholar is easy. To request an application form you can either:
