#### WHAT IS IT?

Catastrophe on Campus offers your students a sustained programme of on campus visits and online mentoring to encourage and support them through the first two terms of year 10. The programme also offers students the chance to visit other universities in order to build a picture of their possible future options and university choices.

#### WHAT WILL YOUR STUDENTS DO?

The programme is split into two halves. The first of these will focus on subject taster sessions to increase student understanding of the options available at university and to build subject specific confidence. The second half will focus on gaining essential academic skills, with students taking part in a group research project and debate.

Parents /carers and teachers are invited to join students at the launch event, the end of first term celebration and for the debate/ graduation at the end of the programme to celebrate their students' achievements and successes.
