

Widening Participation & Outreach (WP&O) Department

In2Surrey Targeting Criteria

To be eligible for the In2Surrey scheme, you must meet two or more of the below criteria:

- Your parents/carers have not attended university in the UK
- The main income earners in your household are in nonprofessional occupations
- You are eligible for a 16-19 bursary (or equivalent)
- You are eligible for free school meals (or have been previously)
- You are a young carer (aged under 18 and currently looking after a relative with a disability, illness or mental health condition)
- You are from a Gypsy or traveller community
- You are from a military family
- You are from a black or minority ethnic (BME) group
- You are a mature learner
- You are a refugee with settled status in the UK
- You are a care leaver or have experience of being looked after by a local authority
- You no longer have contact with your immediate family
- You have a disability or long term health problem which affects your daily life
- You live in an area with low rates of progression to higher education (based on postcode data)*
- Your studies have suffered from significant disruption due to illness, personal circumstances or similar
