# **Student Jobs**

Most students will look to earn some money through **part-time employment** alongside studies and / or through **casual seasonal work** during vacations.

Whilst this type of work is often not related to future career goals (as an internship or work placement might be) it can be a good way of earning extra cash to supplement student loans.

Whilst limited employment can be beneficial it is important to be sensible about the number of hours you take on in order to make sure that there is no impact on your studies.

In fact student jobs can significantly enhance your CV as it can develop many of the skills employers value such as *team working, customer service, initiative and time management* to name but a few.

#### Direct approaches to possible employers

Try direct approaches to possible employers. Shops, bars and restaurants often have vacancies for part-time shop assistants, waiting staff etc.

Many retail companies will be recruiting additional staff for the Christmas period from early autumn – look out for advertisements in stores.

#### Getting a National Insurance (NI) number

- When you start work your employer will ask for your National Insurance (NI) number.
- If you do not have a National Insurance number you can apply for one by telephone. Call the National Insurance number application line on: 0800 141 2075
   Lines are open Monday – Friday, 8am – 6pm.

- This government website indicates that some people who have moved to the UK may find that they already have a National Insurance Number printed on the back of their Biometric Residence Permit (BRP).

#### Minimum wage

#### **Unpaid Work Experience**

- Some private employers offer unpaid work experience.
- Please note: There are particular rules which apply to unpaid work experience with private employers, and the work an employer can ask you to undertake before they are obliged to pay you the minimum wage.

When looking for work please be aware that most websites will not vet or fully research the practices of the employers that advertise with them.

Wherever you see a vacancy advertised (even if it is through our vacancy service), make sure you are happy with the terms of employment, rate of pay etc.
