

CATASTROPHE ON CAMPUS







Catastrophe on Campus offers your students a sustained, attainment raising, programme of on campus visits to encourage and support them through the first two terms of year 10. The programme also offers students the chance to visit a different university in order to build a picture of their possible future options and university choices.

WHAT WILL YOUR STUDENTS DO?

The programme is split into two halves. The first of these is built around a story line, with students taking part in various subject taster sessions to solve the mystery on campus. The subject taster sessions will include samples across the three faculties at the University of Surrey: Arts and Social sciences, Engineering and Physical Sciences and Health and Medical Sciences. These sessions will aim to increase student understanding of the options available at university and to build subject specific confidence. The second half will focus on gaining essential academic skills, with students taking part in a group research project in the University library.

Parents /carers and teachers are invited to join students at the launch event, the end of first term celebration and for the research project presentations and graduation at the end of the programme to celebrate their students' achievements and successes.
