






Why international business management at Surrey Business School?

BSc International Business Management

- » Explore how organisations of all sizes start, run and thrive in an international context
- Sain a firm foundation in international business management which can be applied across a variety of careers and sectors.
- » Duration: 3 years (4 with placement year)
- » Minimum entry requirements: ABB (or CCD with foundation year)
- » Required subjects: GCSE English language at Grade C (4) and mathematics at Grade C (4) (or equivalent)
- » English language requirements: IELTS score of 6.5 (or equivalent).


