## Re-admission to taught programmes following lack of academic progress

On 9<sup>th</sup> March 2020, Senate Chair's Action was taken to agree the amendment to the A1 Regulations in respect of re-admission to taught programmes with immediate effect. This amendment would allow former Surrey students whose programme of study had been terminated for lack of academic progress to be re-admitted to a different programme of study within the University under the regulations for the recognition of prior credit and prior learning without being disadvantaged when compared to the University of Surrey's admission of former students from other Higher Education Institutions.

The following regulation for 2019/20 relating to re-admission to taught programmes is effected by the Senate amendment; deletions are shown in strikethrough:

Regulation 50	Re-admission to taught programmes
	Where a student's registration has been terminated, the student may not
	re-apply for the same programme, with the exception of support to study
	cases where the student has subsequently been confirmed fit to study.
	Students whose studies have been terminated by the University for lack
	of academic progress may not return to study on the same programme or
	one that shares 50% or more of the content of the original programme.
	Students who are re-admitted will be required to relinquish any
	intermediate exit awards they have taken before they register.
