


Studentships

- The University's Doctoral College funds a significant number of studentships each year for talented applicants, usually launched in the autumn.

- » Check FindAPhD regularly or visit: surrey.ac.uk/pgr-studentships










- » If you are applying for a particular studentship opportunity, contact details of the relevant academic are included in the studentship advert.






- » Visit either findaphd.com, jobs.ac.uk or surrey.ac.uk/pgr-studentships to view our full list of current studentship opportunities.
- Your studentship application is separate to your course application.





- » Go to the relevant programme page to apply via surrey.ac.uk/pgr-programmes.
- » In the research interests section, include details of any discussions with supervisors, and a research proposal (if required).
- » Make sure you include scanned copies of any relevant documentation that you need to provide.
- » You'll need to provide contact details for two referees.





- » You can track the progress of your application through our Surrey Self-Service website.
- The time it takes varies. Avoid unnecessary delays by making sure you complete the application in full and attach all documentation.
- » If you have any questions, contact admissions@surrey.ac.uk or your prospective supervisor.
- » Accept your offer via Surrey Self-Service.
