A WOMAN'S VOICE IN TECH AND TRAVEL

As technology advances, the travel and tourism industry is becoming more and more dependent on these digital platforms and innovations. As we progress towards workplace equality, arguably woman are still underrepresented in the UK's technology workforce with only <u>23%</u> of people working in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) roles being female. This stark **gender imbalance** in the tech industry makes it one of the most male-orientated occupations in the UK, experiencing a growing shortfall of IT professionals. To increase this representation employers could place a priority on encouraging women to pursue tech roles through mentoring and training programmes. The strong numerical dominance of males in this field has created a systemic hegemony that calls for a disintegration in gender biases that will raise woman's confidence and aspirations in tech-based companies.

The <u>IWTTF digital conference</u> recognises that strides can be made in the tech and travel industry through shattering the '<u>glass slipper effect</u>'! This encapsulates when occupations are associated with distinctive characteristics making them suited for certain people, in this case males in the tech industry. Role models are fundamental in encouraging learning and challenging our own prejudices. Female role models associated with STEM can be highly effective in negating the '<u>stereotype threat</u>' of this industry.
