

Adopting a multidisciplinary approach, contributors examine a variety of key topics, including, for example, H&T management practices and management innovation in Africa, the drivers of and variation in uptake of Western management practices, policies and strategies to promote the development of H&T organizations, the influence of management practices on the competitiveness of African countries as tourism destinations, and areas for improvement of H&T organizations in Africa in the digital age. Both local and global perspectives are presented by authors from Africa, Europe, North America, and Asia, with inclusion of intra- and intercountry comparisons, making the book essential reading for scholars, managers, and policy makers with an interest in H&T in Africa.
