In Memoriam: Prof David Harrison

Professor Harrison completed his PhD in Social Anthropology at University College, University of London and held academic posts at the Universities of Sussex and North London before taking up the post of Head of School of Tourism and Hospitality at the University of the South Pacific, Fiji Islands.

He was an influential tourism scholar particularly known for his work on tourism in developing economies and his passing is a great loss to the tourism academy.

Benchmarking Diversity and Inclusivity in the UK Event Industry: A State of the Nation

The conversation around diversity at UK events and conferences has recently intensified, particularly in the last twelve months, adding to various recent global movements, such as #MeToo, #BlackLivesMatter, #HeForShe, and has built on the recent increasing awareness of cognitive diversity. The shift to virtual events in the midst of the pandemic has highlighted the importance of improving inclusivity of events in online settings. In collaboration with GET DICE Ltd, **Dr Yanning Li** and **Dr Bora Kim** are to map and analyse the landscape and scale of diversity and inclusivity in the UK event industry focusing on online events that took place in 2020 based on the nine protected characteristics in the UK Equality Act (2010).

The project, funded by the ESRC Business Collaboration Fund, will help understand: (a) the equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI) landscape of UK-organised online events from speaker line-ups to marketing materials and accessible technology,

- (b) the practical and perceived challenges preventing UK event organisers from promoting diverse and inclusive events, and
- (c) the perceptions of UK event organisers with regard to benefits from regulatory and educational support.

The project will also help design an online scoreboard system where any event organisation can submit their event details to obtain an assessment on their EDI profile and to compare themselves with industry benchmarks that will be provided by the GET DICE database, which the project findings will feed into. In particular, **Dr Li** leads a qualitative study with event organisers across the UK to understand their current challenges and visions of achieving EDI in their events, while **Dr Kim** utilises data mining methods and content analysis to assess how UK events are performing on the EDI dimensions.
