HISTORY



OVER

50 years OF GRADUATING STUDENTS

The University of Surrey's first degree conferment ceremony was held in University Hall at Battersea in December 1966, and some of our other early ceremonies took place in Central Hall, Westminster. When we moved to Guildford in 1966, the Civic Hall and other local locations around Guildford were used for graduation ceremonies. Since July 1970, by kind permission of the Dean and Chapter, degree conferment ceremonies have been held in Guildford Cathedral. On these occasions it is used as a secular building.



►►► The mace

The University mace was designed and crafted by Desmond Clen Murphy, and was used ceremonially for the first time at the Installation as Chancellor of the Rt Hon the Lord Robens of Woldingham in the Civic Hall, Guildford on Saturday 22 October 1966.

The mace is made of silver and walnut wood, with the shield of the University coat of arms on its head in colour, and with the shields of the coat of arms of Surrey County Council, Guildford Borough Council and Battersea Polytechnic Institute engraved in silver underneath. The embroidered coat of arms on the mace table, carried out in metallic thread, French knots, applied leathers and various materials, was created by Christine Habib, a former student of the Hampton School of Embroidery.

The mace was presented to Guildford Cathedral for permanent display on 13 July 1997.



►►► The arms of the University of Surrey

The University of Surrey coat of arms marks the University's move from London to Guildford. The woolpacks on the shield are taken from the arms of the Borough of Guildford, while the blue and gold chequers and mantling are from the arms of the former Earls of Surrey. The swords, an allusion to the arms of the City of London, are taken from the shield of Battersea Polytechnic.

The blazon of the University's coat of arms, which was granted in 1966, is topped by a stag resting its right leg on an upturned key. The stag denotes the medieval royal hunting park on which our leafy Stag Hill site has been developed, while the key is a heraldic symbol of learning.

The coat of arms is an elegant symbol of our reputation and standing.

Academic DRESS

Every university has a distinctive set of academic robes for the degrees it awards and special ceremonial robes for the high officers of the university.

The blue brocade that features in the hoods of all our robes is unique to Surrey and distinguishes us from other universities.

GRADUATE ROBES

Undergraduate and masters degrees

Graduates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Hoods are usually fully lined with blue brocade and vary in design depending on whether the award is undergraduate or postgraduate.



Diploma and certificate awards

Diplomates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Postgraduate hoods are fully lined with blue brocade, with a plain white trim. Undergraduate hoods have a blue brocade and plain white trim.



Doctorate awards

Gowns are in cardinal red with blue brocade on the front facings. The hoods are cardinal red, fully lined with University brocade and have a ribbon trim rebated from the outside edge of the hood. The hat is a black cloth bonnet with red cord and tassels, with the exception of Doctors of Letters, Science and Medicine where the cord and tassels are gold.

The colour of the trim on the hoods denotes the type of degree:

Bachelor and Master of Arts, Doctor of Letters - Red ribbon

Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Education - Green ribbon

Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Engineering - Grey ribbon

Bachelor and Master of Laws - Purple ribbon

Bachelor and Master of Music - White brocade

Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Science - No trim

Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine - Pale yellow ribbon

Master of Business - Ruby ribbon

Master of Chemistry / of Computing / of Mathematics / in Physics / in Science (MSci) - Pale blue ribbon



Master and Doctor of Business Administration - Gold ribbon

Master of Fine Arts - Strawberry ribbon

Master of Research - Apricot ribbon

Master of Philosophy - Blue brocade lining extending to the outside edge of the hood

Doctor of Clinical Practice - Turquoise ribbon

Doctor of Medicine - Burnt orange ribbon

Doctor of Philosophy - No ribbon trim

Doctor of Psychology - Pale blue ribbon trim rebated from the outside edge of the hood.

Dame Glynis Breakwell – Ceremony 7

Dame Glynis Breakwell DBE is a social psychologist and chartered health psychologist specialising on identity processes, risk reactions, leadership, and the dynamics of trust. She has researched people's responses to BSE, HIV/AIDS, bioterrorism, climate change, pandemic influenza and COVID-19 and has helped develop policies for managing such public crises. Her books include 'Coping with Threatened Identities' and 'The Psychology of Risk'.

She received her PhD from the University of Bristol and DSc from the University of Oxford. She is a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences and Honorary Fellow of the British Psychological Society. In 2014, the UK Science Council named her one of the 100 leading practicing scientists in the UK. She was made Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire in 2012 for contributions to higher education.

For 19 years, Dame Glynis worked at the University of Surrey, arriving as a lecturer, and leaving in 2001 as Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Research and Enterprise. She is now Professor Emeritus at the University of Bath, where she was the Vice-Chancellor and President from 2001-2018. She is also Visiting Professor at the Institute for Global Health Innovation, Imperial College, London, and at the University of Surrey.

Dr Anita Green – Ceremony 5

Anita is a director of nursing research, education and development working at Sussex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust and is a visiting professor at the University of Surrey. Her current role involves managing a department that focuses on all aspects of nurse and nursing associate education, training, development and nursing research. She started her mental health nurse training in 1981 as a post-registered RMN student having completed her registered general nurse training. After qualifying as an RMN Anita held a number of mental health clinical and operational posts, including joint appointments and clinical academic posts. She is a qualified nurse teacher and her clinical and academic work has focused on working with people who have drug and/or alcohol problems. From 1995 to 2004 Anita co-ordinated drug and alcohol training and education programmes for nurses, nurse teachers and doctors based in St. Petersburg, Russia. From 2001-2004 this work became her doctoral thesis. Anita joined Sussex Partnership as a dual diagnosis nurse consultant in 2008, later moving full time into nursing education and research. She became a visiting professor at the University of Surrey in 2018. In 2019, the 70th anniversary of the NHS, Anita was successful in becoming a National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) 70@70 Senior Nurse Leader. Roles awarded to acknowledge the importance of increasing nursing and midwifery research activity. She is now an active member of the 70@70 alumni.



Dr Ami Sawran – Ceremony 6

Ami graduated as a vet from Liverpool University in 2011, before undertaking a production animal junior clinical scholarship at the Royal Veterinary College. Ami then continued at RVC, gaining a PhD in dairy cattle lameness detection and genomics. Her clinical interests have always been farm focused, with some locuming in charity practice during her PhD. Ami is now a clinical director at Westpoint Farm Vets in Chelmsford, and sits on the Production Animal Clinical Board, Farm Executive Board and Farm Marketing Team at VetPartners. Her professional journey has been varied. Later in her clinical career, Ami completed a Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice, after developing an interest in camelid medicine. As a leader within her team, her efforts have been concentrated on the fulfilment of veterinary colleagues at work, which led to Westpoint Chelmsford winning the 2018 Small Practice Veterinary Wellbeing Awards. Ami's continued investment in extending the lessons learned to the whole profession led to her successful appointment to the Society of Practising Veterinary Surgeons board in 2021, where she hopes to give more veterinary professionals the tools to thrive in practice, and to increase opportunities for aspiring vets from all walks of life.



Professor Sir Peter Downes, OBE, FRSE, FMedSci – Ceremony 8

Pete retired as Principal and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Dundee after ten years in the role at the end of 2018. He currently serves in non-executive roles including as President of the UK Biochemical Society, Board Chair at Dynamic Earth, Edinburgh and others.

Under his leadership the University of Dundee was consistently rated best in Scotland for student experience by Times Higher Education, achieved record levels of research funding and was twice named THE Scottish University of the Year.

He was Convener of Universities Scotland from August 2012 to July 2016, leading the sector's position on Brexit and Scottish Independence and overseeing its response to the Scottish Government's review of HE governance.

Pete is one of the UK's leading biochemists who has worked in both universities and industry. He was a founder of the Division of Signal Transduction Therapy, attracting more than £60 million of funding from world leading Pharma companies, winning a coveted Queen's Anniversary Award and being an exemplar of university/industry collaboration. Before being appointed Principal he led the College of Life Sciences at

Dundee to number 1 in the REF rankings for Biological Sciences. Pete was awarded the Colworth Medal of the British Biochemical Society in 1987 and was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh in 1991 and a Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences in 2009. He was honoured by the Queen with an OBE in 2004 and a Knighthood in 2015.



Dr Margaret Ashwell, OBE – Ceremony 9

Margaret is proud to be a scientist. She is a Registered Nutritionist who can describe her professional career in three objects: A boomerang, a fishing net and a piece of string.

The boomerang effect is exemplified by the fact that Margaret is immediate Past President/ Chair of the Association for Nutrition, serving from 2016 to 2021. She was Honorary Secretary of The Nutrition Society from 1984 to 1988 and saw the inception of the first Register of Nutritionists. Not bad for someone who chose to completely skip the nutrition module in her first-degree course in Physiology and Biochemistry at the University of Southampton, eh?

What about the fishing net? Margaret has been a Research Scientist with the Medical Research Council, Principal of the Good Housekeeping Institute, Science Director of the British Nutrition Foundation and, for more than 25 years, Director of Ashwell Associates, her own nutrition science consultancy. During her career, she was the Founder of the Adipose Tissue Discussion Group in 1973, co-Founder of the European Association for the Study of Obesity in 1986 and, in 1996, the Founder of SENSE (Self-Employed Nutritionists Support and Enlightenment). In all cases, Margaret recognised that a support network did not exist and so she just got on and started one. Hence the fishing net.

Finally, the piece of string. Way back in 1996, Margaret was among the first to advocate the use of the waist-to-height ratio (WHtR) as an indicator of early health risk.

This simple method has just been proposed in the new 2022 guidelines from NICE . Margaret has continually advocated the boundary value of WHtR=0.5 which leads to the simple public health message “Keep your waist to less than half your height”. So primary health screening for men, women and children in all ethnic groups only requires a piece of string.

Margaret served on the UK Government’s Food Advisory Committee for 9 years and was rewarded with the OBE. She has been a Senior Visiting Fellow at Bayes Business School, City, University, London since 2015. She received an Honorary Doctor of Science from the University of Westminster in 2018 and was delighted to receive an Honorary Doctor of Education (Sciences) from Liverpool Hope University in 2022. In 2019, Margaret became a founding Trustee of the Academy of Nutrition Sciences which will give enormous strength to the nutrition profession.

Editing the biography of the nutrition pioneers, McCance and Widdowson, published in 1993 is the project which has given Margaret most satisfaction. She has continued to undertake many fascinating projects about Elsie Widdowson, including the instigation and unveiling of her blue plaque in 2021. In the same year, she edited a collation of autobiographies of Past Presidents and Honorary Fellows for the Nutrition Society.

Margaret lives in the lovely village of Ashwell in North Hertfordshire and her passions are her family, playing golf and pickleball and, for her sins, supporting Southampton FC.

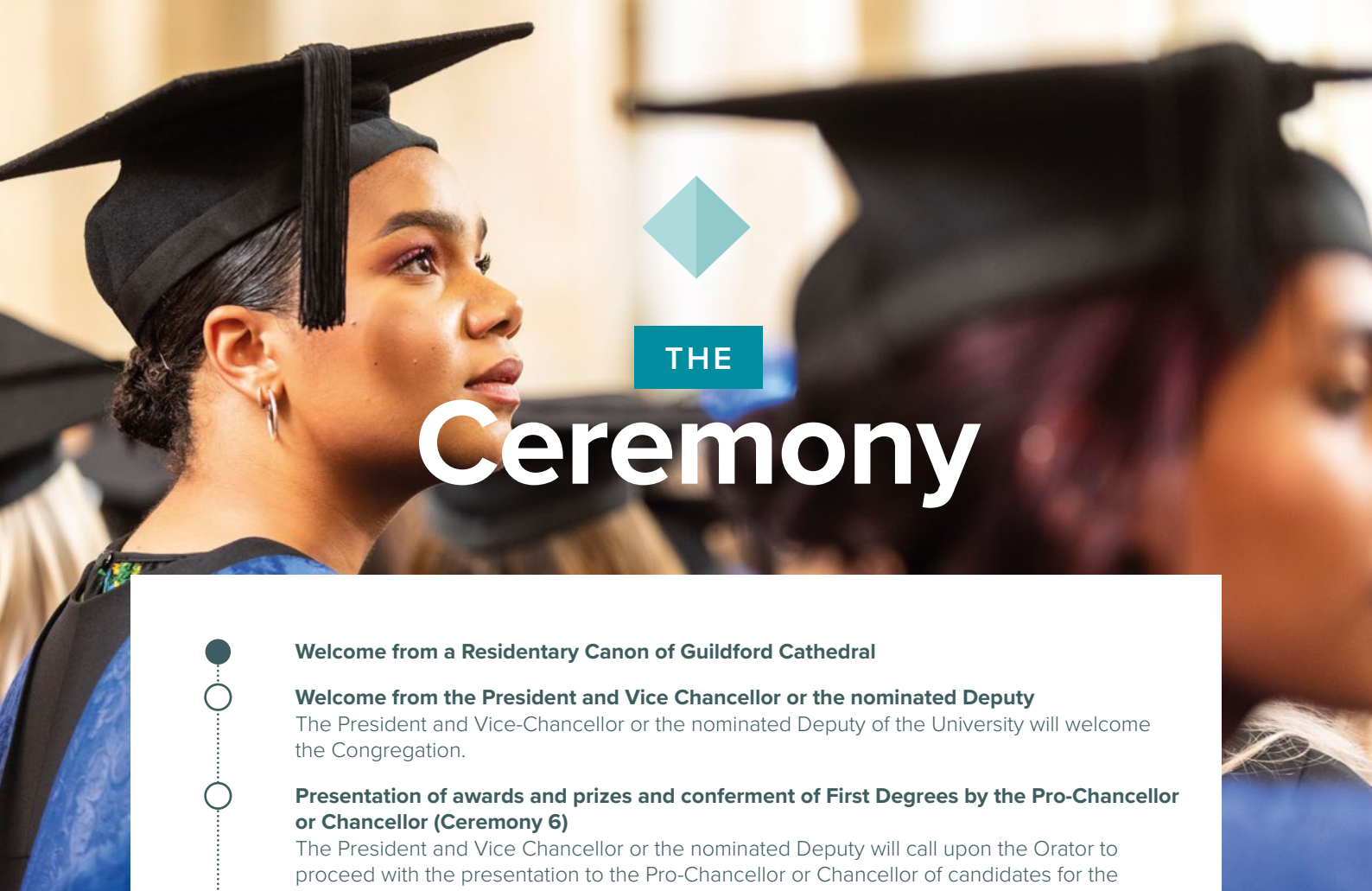
