- Your university account gives you access to a range of IT services

- > A wide range of software available, most for free
- Email with 100GB of storage
- A personal file store with 1TB of storage using OneDrive
- Wired and Wireless access to the internet
- Remote Access and Virtual Desktop service for off campus access
- Online Library Resource
- Visit MySurrey for all services and IT information





Your IT Account

- Your university username and password gives you access to most systems and services
- You will need to use the Microsoft Authenticator App on your mobile phone when logging into University services.
- First, you need to activate your account, then set up Microsoft Multi-factor authentication (MFA)
- Next, set up your self-service password reset
- Once set up you can change or reset your password at any time via the links on MySurrey
- Your account details are for your use only. IT will never ask for your password

The Internet

- Whilst studying at Surrey you can connect your personal devices to the university's wireless network.
- Secure Wireless internet access is available on campus using eduroam
- Connect to eduroam using the eduroam CAT app
- Visit MySurrey for details on how to connect
- Guest Wi-Fi also available
- Wired Service
- High-speed wired network to desk 1GB
- > 10GB between buildings










Microsoft Office 365 is available for free to all students. Download it onto up to 5 personal devices from Software365.surrey.ac.uk





Email

- Email and calendar with 100GB of storage
- Your University email is the main point of contact between you and the University so check it regularly
- You can access email from any device connected to the Internet
- Log into your email by visiting: surrey365.surrey.ac.uk
- Download the mobile app to access from you phone
- More information about how to access Surrey365 can be found on MySurrey







Saving your files

- All PhD students are provided with 1TB of personal file storage to save their work using OneDrive
- With OneDrive you can share files and access them anywhere with a good internet connection
- This space is secure and is backed up frequently
- We recommend that you use this for all your important non research work documents
- When you leave the university the files in your OneDrive will be purged to protect your personal data
- If using HPC you will need dedicated HPC storage
- Your OneDrive is not accessible from HPC services
- If you are actively involved in research, OneDrive may not meet your funder's data management requirements
- Research students should check with their supervisors about whether their data needs to be stored securely in a shared folder
- For project and research storage space, research students can apply for 20GB. Talk to IT if large spaces are required and we can advise:

Printing

- > Printing, photocopying and scanning is available across campus
- Your printing account will be preloaded with an initial credit. Once this is used up, you can add more money via the link surrey.ac.uk/printcredits (using your university account details).
- **On campus** to send a document to a University MFD/printer from:
- > A University lab PC select SurreyPrint from the printer options.
- A mobile phone or tablet please use mobile printing or web printing.
- A personal laptop or PC download SurreyPrint onto your personal device. Do not use mobile or web printing on campus from a personal laptop or PC.

Off campus

- using your own device, you will need to use 'web printing' or 'mobile printing'.
- All print jobs are held in a central queue for up to 72 hours and can be collected from any of the hundreds of MFDs on campus by swiping your campus card on the MFD and using the touch screen to press 'Print'. Visit it.surrey.ac.uk/printing-campus for full instructions.





Remote Access

- Most services including email, MySurrey, Teams, OneDrive, office365 and some web services can be accessed from anywhere with a good internet connection
- Download the MySurrey App onto your mobile for quick access to all the most useful university services.
- The remote access service is called GlobalProtect. Instructions about how to connect are at it.surrey.ac.uk
- Services requiring remote access include, Library Resources, Journals & Exam Papers and the Printing Online Payment System.
- We also have ssh servers you can use to get access to services. Two factor authentication will be needed when logging into access.eps.surrey.ac.uk.
- To access physical Linux lab machines remotely you can use <u>https://remotelabs.eps.surrey.ac.uk</u>





Virtual Workspaces

- Transform your device into a virtual University workspace so you have the same experience as you would if you were using a PC on campus
- This service gives you access to your University Windows workspace from anywhere with a good internet connection.

Which Workspace do I use?

» Virtual Workspace

The standard offering which contains most of the university software you may require. This includes Office, IBM SPSS and MATLAB, to name a few.

» Enhanced Workspace

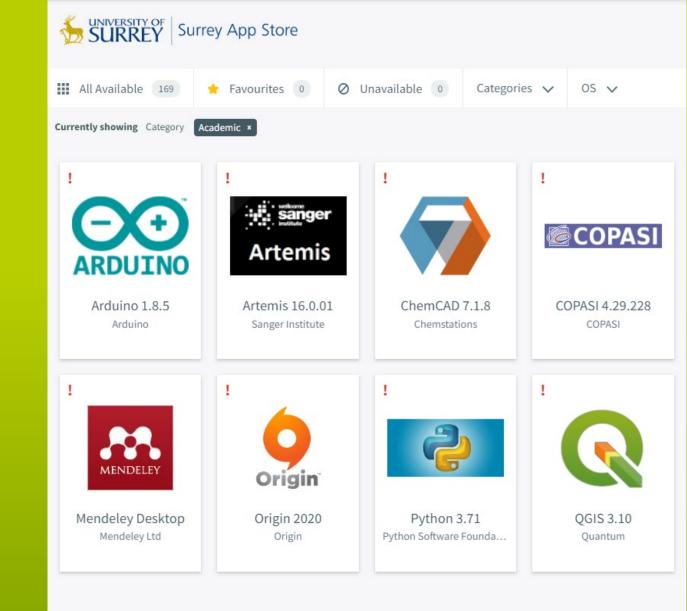
The enhanced pool offers a GPU accelerated desktop environment which includes most engineering related packages, such as ANSYS, SAP 2000 and AutoCAD.





Software and Apps

- IT Services offer a wide variety of software in the Computer Labs on campus as well as licensed software for your own device
- Access software across a range of operating systems for free at: appstore.surrey.ac.uk
- Log in using your university account details
- Applications are delivered to your computer in minutes
- As a student at Surrey, you can download Microsoft Office 365
- You will also be eligible for several offers and discounts on Apple, Microsoft and Dell products.





IT Security

- Everyone is responsible to practice good cyber security to protect yourself, your fellow students and the University.
- » The number of attacks on universities is rising.
- » We are committed to maintaining the highest standards of cyber security certification to reinforce and demonstrate our defensive capabilities.
- Everyone must complete essential security training to help you recognise the risks and know what actions to take.

Password

When you create your University password you should:

- > Ensure it is a unique password that you do not use anywhere else
- Ensure your password does not contain easy to guess information such as your birthday or pet's name
- Never share your password
- > Never write your password down

Phishing

If you receive an email that seems suspicious

- Report it to IT
- Do not respond
- > Do not click any links or open any attachment
- Do not forward to anyone other than IT If you are unsure if the email is or is not suspicious, always ask IT to confirm, you should not investigate the email yourself.

Protecting your data

- Ensure your University files are stored in OneDrive so that they are backed up and protected.
- Personal files should not be stored in OneDrive as you will no longer have access to this after you graduate

Updating your machine: It is important you ensure your device is up-to-date at all times. Instructions on how to check the status of your machine can be found on MySurrey

Antivirus: Please ensure you have adequate virus protection in place on your device. Further instructions can be found on MySurrey.







IT Procurement

- You may have some involvement with the purchasing of IT hardware or software
- Surrey has various EU, national and regional procurement agreements for the supply of various goods and services, e.g. Desktops and Laptops from Dell, peripherals from Insight and XMA
- Do Not purchase IT equipment with your personal money/credit card
- Contact IT support with your requirements and we will guide you through the process
- > All require budget holder approval and IT sign-off







IT equipment suitability and cost

Seek advise from your Supervisor first then IT can advise on

- Hardware requirements
- New Laptops /Desktops
- Specialist Equipment (e.g. VR HPC)
- Software
 - Identify existing solutions
 - Purchasing new software
 - Reviewing license agreements (freeware isn't always free!)

What is Drop-Off?

- Transfer files to collaborators up to 50GB
- Upload file & add recipients
- Internal and external collaborators
- Temporary (on-premise) storage location
- Data is automatically deleted after 31 days

Compute Services: HPC & HTC

High Performance Computing -Eureka/Eureka2

- Mainly for (parallel) simulations multi-core & multi-node
- Dedicated High performance Parallel storage systems
- Currently Eureka/Eureka2 has 4200+ Cores
- Guest access Try before you buy
- Buy nodes and increase your fairshare! Request a quote from IT

<u>High Throughput Computing – HTCondor</u>

- GPU Compute & Data-intensive workloads
- <u>AI@SURREY</u> dedicated condor pool for AI workloads, coupled with High performance WEKA powered storage system.





GitLab – Great for Coders!

GitLab

- Code repository
- Versioning, branching, issues
- Multiple users collaborate on shared code base
- Distribute code
- Internal & external collaborators
- ~2000 repositories and ~1500 users









Introducing MySurrey Engagement

Power up your learning journey (only available for PGTs)

- MySurrey Engagement is a web-based platform bringing together data from online resources such as SurreyLearn, e-textbooks, and captured content, plus assessment submissions.
- An overall engagement rating and graphical learning journey map will be available to you.
- You and your Personal Tutor and other academics will be to see how you are progressing and how you can maximise your learning.
- Accessing MySurrey Engagement on daily basis will give you the opportunity to track your progress, respond to messages and spot opportunities to improve. You may even compare yourself with others on your programme.
