	Detailed reports were provided prior to the meeting and available to the committee. Major ethical/welfare notifications are summarised below:	
	NACWO: Colitis mouse line has become well established; 12 mice have now been euthanised due to reaching the load criteria under their PPL; tissues from some animals were collected but as some of these animals were the 'founding' animals of the colony, their microbiomes may not fully reflect their new environment.	
	PPL Standard condition 18 Notification: NACWO/NVS provided overview of incident that occurred while animals were under anaesthesia for a surgical procedure, one mouse out of 10 developed	



	damage to their ears. The condition of the ear deteriorated, and the animal was subsequently euthanised, but as this was not listed as an expected adverse effect, a SC18 report was submitted. Burn damage was suggested as most likely cause, but as this mouse was not sent to histopathology to confirm the cause of damage, members proposed that a standard procedure should be established when dealing with unexpected events. The heat pads used were replaced.	9/23 NACWO to write/check SOP

	culture of care, members who are interested to contact Chair. NTCO: No major ethical notifications. Other things to note, two NACWOs will be attending IAT congress at the end of March. HOLC: No major ethical notifications.	
	NASPA Chair: NASPA recently appointed a Deputy Chair. No major ethical notifications.	
	NEER Officer: Review on "Control of avian pathogenic Escherichia coli by non-antibiotic compounds inducing trained immunity of chicken macrophages" was finalised, after receiving comments from AWERB members the communication was sent to applicants.	
	User Forum Chair: The BRF is working for the Zebrafish facility to be functional for new academic year. Concerns have been raised as to the procedures in place during the construction to minimise vibrations/noises and stress on animals housed nearby. 5.	Updates on external-facing animal communication items:	
	 Communications plan-moved to next meeting Open Day leaflet-a feedback on the leaflet was provided by the External Lay Member. It was agreed a fold out leaflet format would be favourable. It was suggested that the information on the leaflet should be aligned with information on the AWERB Website which is yet still awaiting updating. The Chair of AWERB called out for volunteers within the committee to lead on a small working group focusing on developing the website. 	3/23 Member of Comms Team to provide update at next meeting. 6.	Concordat on Openness on Animal Research:	
	Home office Liaison contact and Named Information Officer from The Pirbright Institute gave presentation on the Openness within their Institute. The presentation was followed by questions from the	



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	committee. One of the questions was regarding animal suffering and if the institute is planning to upload information regarding levels of suffering or information on severity of some procedures since this is important for overall openness on animal use. It was noted that the Institute's approach to openness includes both internal and external aspect at the same level. Reflections on concordat planning/progress: NACWO 1 mentioned that to move forward with our concordat planning additional resources and support particularly from the communication team would be beneficial.	
7.	Care of culture and application of the 3Rs	
	3Rs champions reported they are working on integrating their work and creating a document. The champions are planning to meet monthly to continue with this project.	5/23 Draft document to be circulated before next meeting
8.	NEER reflections	
	NEER officer provided a presentation on ideas around NEER review process and explained the reasons for formal process. There is currently a challenge with capturing NEER activities, to be able to achieve that it would be beneficial to get additional resources/ support. This presentation will be shared with the committee to reflect on this subject further and the discussion around this will continue at next meeting.	12/23 NEER review discussions continued at next meeting
9.	Ethics case examples for discussion:	
	 Collecting oral swab sample in cattle- would this be a regulated procedure? 	
	Conflicting opinions from NVSs. Discussion focused on how the swab will be collected, how will the animal be restrained, or where in mouth swab is taken. Recommendation to contact HO for opinion.	13/23 NACWO to seek HO opinion
	 Is NASPA review required when excess samples from a Home Office licenced research project are being used? 	
	Currently, the excess from samples collected as part of recognised veterinary practice under the Veterinary Surgeons Act can be used without a NASPA review. However, SAGE-AR process does not allow for excess from samples collected under an ASPA licence to be used without NASPA review. Should similar principles be applied? Members thought the use of excess samples from ASPA work should be encouraged not impeded.	
	If the additional use of the tissue was planned, this would be regulated however if it was just spare at the end of the experiment, it would have to be justified, unless it was for post-mortem samples.	14/23 NASPA Chair/NEER officer to co-ordinate



	If the sample is from a project being carried out at Surrey, a collaboration between researchers is considered as good practice and no additional ethical review would be required. However, it would be beneficial to record this activity via NEER process.
