	NVS: Incorporated into the NACWO report. No concerns.	
	NACWO: Training on lymph node identification and dissection in mice provided to external researcher. Animals from 4 project licences currently housed in facility.	
	NTCO and HOLC: Training exemption sought for PPL holder applicant. Home Office stipulated training must be within last 5 years. Annual returns are due.	
	NIO: A researcher was successful in obtaining NC3Rs funding on developing a non-animal method to study heart disease. The NC3Rs Study Plan is now live. The OBSERVE guidelines for rodent cancer models will be reviewed at May meeting. Brief discussion on how Al might aid development of clinical score sheets to be followed up at next meeting.	3/25 NEER Officer: AI & clinical scoring



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	NASPA Chair: List of new approved applications and amendments were shared. Two tissue audit actions completed; work is commencing on outstanding actions which focus on proportionate review of activities (risk management) and feasibility of compliance checks. NEER Officer: One application approved. Concerns that current system appears not to be capturing all external activity. Suggestion to link into grant submission (FRIO) form. Noted that deputy NASPA Chair oversees grant bid review process. User Forum Chair: Provided an update on impact of environmental environment on over-grooming in mice. Help has been sought with data analyses. User community concerned about lack of available statistical input.	
4.	End-of-year summary AWERB/NASPA Chairs shared the end-of-year summary statistics with the committee. Key achievements related to the revamp of university animal ethics portal (SAGE-AR), streamlining of NASPA documents, development of a training module for Schedule 1 users, drafting of the 3Rs strategy document and participation at various external events including a school visit. Committee reflected on the need for on-going work to improve communication and provide clarity on the need for, and review process of animal work performed elsewhere. Discussion also reflected that the source of animals (i.e. pets/livestock vs laboratory) needed to be considered.

5.	i) The Lay Member provided a summary of the presentations/discussions from the RSPCA Laypersons Forum meeting (9/12/2024). Topics covered included induction and training, replacement, empathising with animals, and 'what AWERB members' need. Committee heard more about two of these items: i) the RSPCA led project on 'Replacement' including the creation of a 'replacement checklist' and 'infographic' to help AWERBs review activities. It was recognised that there has/is a movement away from using animals, but it is challenging due to lack of funding/resource. Additionally, committee reflected some research questions may not be possible to address using current non-animal approaches. ii) Induction and training – workshop members felt adequate training and induction material was not always available. Laymember shared resources. NIO committed to updating current university member induction pack. ii) ARRIVE Study Plans – these have now been made available online and the Chair requested that the NVS/NACWO and interested researchers looked at these in detail to see if any improvements/changes can be applied to university forms. iii) UAR webinar presentation – NIO summarised main points presented at recent UAR webinar on writing non-technical summaries (NTS).
